Lions Clubs Objectives

To create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world.

To promote the principles of good government and good citizenship.

To take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.

To unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.

To provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.

To hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on the account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

Always to bear in mind the obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give to them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

To aid my fellow men by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

To be careful with my criticisms and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.



THE EMBLEM

A large letter "L" standing for Law-Liberty-Labor-Loyalty-Love-Life-Lions; on a circle representing the Lions and Lions Clubs all bound together into one; Lions profiles looking two ways, representing a Lion looking every direction for an opportunity to give unselfish service, with the word "Lions" at the top representing the Association, and the word "International" at the bottom indicating it is the unwritten obligation of every Lion to wear and display his emblem with pride.

THE NAME

The "LIONS" proper name is: "The International Association of Lions Clubs."

THE COLORS **Purple and Gold**

To Lions, purple stands for loyalty to country, loyalty to one's self and to the integrity of mind and heart. It is the traditional color of strength, courage and tireless dedication to a cause. Gold symbolizes sincerity of purpose, liberality in judgment, purity in life and generosity in mind, heart and purse toward his fellow man.

THE NEW LION

You were not asked to join the Lions Club just by chance, for some good Lion member, prior to recommending you as a prospective member to his Board of Directors, watched you or worked with you. He was satisfied that you had a sense of community responsibility, that you were interested in seeing your community become better and better still, you were prepared to give your time, your energy and your talent, together with other members of the community, to see that it did become a better place to live, and meet the needs of the population which they themselves could not meet.

Your sponsoring Lion felt this so strongly that he chanced his reputation in his Lions Club to recommend and sponsor you as a fellow Lion.

When you became a member of the Lions Club, it indicated to the other Lions that you accepted the responsibility to your community and to your club to support it in all of its projects and to give your club freely of your time, your ability and your knowledge, to enter into a sense of fellowship with each of the members and to do all in your power to make your Lions Club grow and become a greater leader in the community.

WHO ARE THE LIONS

The members of the Lions Club are people from all walks of life who are pledged to help through Lionism those less fortunate than themselves. As members, they are part of an international service organization that has aided people all over the world. Lionism is nonsectarian, yet it encourages religious observances and church loyalties. It is nonpolitical, yet it inculcates a lively interest in government and civic affairs.

MEMBERSHIP POLICY

The objectives of the Lions Club of Bolivar are as follows: to determine community needs and develop means of meeting them, either through our own efforts or in cooperation with other agencies; to unite its members in friendship and mutual understanding; and to cooperate, when asked, with area Lions Clubs and/or District projects.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

An initiation fee of \$30.00 is required from each member with submission of application into the club. This fee covers the cost of your Lions membership pin, your member packet and name badge, State and International dues.

Membership dues of \$37.50 bi-annually are to be paid by January 30th and July 30th. Included in the dues is the cost of two dinners.

Each member's standing will be reviewed by the membership committee two times per year. Items to be reviewed include attendance, support of projects, and prompt payment of dues. If a member is considered not to be in good standing, the Board of Directors shall direct the Secretary to send the member in question a letter regarding his standing.

CLUB MEETINGS

The first meeting of the month will be coat and tie and will be program night.

The second meeting of the month will be casual dress and the Board of Directors meeting will be held after the regular meeting.

ATTENDANCE MAKE-UP RULES

1. A meeting of any other Lions Club, either special or regular.
2. A meeting of the Board of Directors of their own club.
3. A duly constituted meeting of a standing committee of their own club.
4. Any meeting scheduled or sponsored by their own club.
5. A Regional or Zone meeting, International, State, District, or area Conventions, or any other recognized Lions meeting.
6. A Lion who visits the Office of Lions International.
7. Attendance of project or service sponsored by the Club.

Committee Chairman should report attendance of special or Committee meetings to the Club Secretary.

For Perfect Attendance Award, missed meetings must be made up 13 days prior or 13 days after the missed meeting.
